Begin at the beginning with something called CONCEPTS OF PRINT.

These concepts are so automatic for adult readers that we don't even think about them-

Things like which way words flow on a page or the fact that reading happens from left to right.

As obvious as they may be to grownups, an awareness of these concepts is not information we are born with. We have to learn them. We have to discover "how print operates".

So grab your child's favourite book or their library book and start reading with these concepts of print in mind.

Where is the back of the book?

Can you find the title?

Can you point to a word?
Can we find two words that are the same?

Can we find two words that are the same?
Can you point to each word as I read?

Directionality of Text.

Where will we start reading the book?

Where will we finish reading the book?

Which way will we go when we read?

Where is the top of the page?

How do you turn a page?



Where do we go when we get to the end of the line? Can you show me the first word on the page?

Let's find the last word on the page.

Can you find the middle of the page?

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
